Who is required to go into isolation?

The goal of isolation is to reduce infection and contain the spread of COVID-19 in Israel. Isolation means avoiding contact with other people, including household members for the period specified in the Ministry of Health Director General Order.



Isolation report for international inbound passengers

If you do not have a permit, you may leave your isolation accommodation **only to get tested for coronavirus.** Traveling to and returning from the testing center must be the shortest possible, without using public transport. If you need to leave your isolation accommodation for another reason, you

need to have **a permit to leave the isolation accommodation**, which will be given only for the following essential cases:

- To receive urgent medical care
- To attend a funeral of a first degree relative and grandchildren
- To attend a wedding, bar mitzvah, bat mitzvah of first degree relatives only for those in isolation due to close contact with a confirmed case
- To attend a bris servic of first degree relatives for those in isolation due to close contact with a confirmed case or after arriving from abroad
- To visit a dying relative only for first degree relative or a close relative
- To accompany a family member undergoing surgery or treatment in a hospital
- To take an examination
- To move to another isolation address (one-off)
- To fly abroad
- To help a person with autistic disorders to go out of isolation to freshen up


You may not leave your isolation accommodation to receive a vaccine. The effectiveness of the vaccine is not compromised even if more than 3 weeks between the two doses elapse.

Apply for a permit to a single exit during isolation

A permit is granted for a **single** exit during isolation and it **cannot** serve as **dispute** on an isolation order or as an application to **shorten** isolation.

Receive a permit to leave the isolation accommodation

Applicants will be emailed a permit to leave the isolation accommodation.

The permit granted is a one off, solely for the purpose for which it was issued and for the date and time it was issued for.

This permit does not mean the isolation period is shortened or that you are exempt from isolation.

The permit is in effect as long as the details in the application provided by the person in isolation remain unchanged, and as long as this person does not have fever or other symptoms in the time between receiving the permit and leaving isolation accommodation.

Permission for Confirmed Cases and People in Isolation to Go Outdoors to Cast their Votes in the Primary Elections (Primaries)

Restrictions on leaving the isolation accommodation

- A permit to leave isolation accommodation will **only be granted if the person in isolation feels well and does not experience any symptoms that are related to COVID-19** (fever, coughs, trouble breathing or other respiratory symptom, or new loss of taste or smell) within 48 hours before leaving the isolation accommodation.
- Mask the isolated person must wear a mask at all times while outside of the isolation accommodation.
- **Social distancing** the isolated person is required to avoid physical contact with any other person and to keep a distance of at least 2 meters from other people.
- **Transport** You can travel to and from the isolation accommodation by a private vehicle to be driven by the isolated person alone without any other passengers.

If it is impossible for the isolated person to drive, the isolated person may travel in a private vehicle driven by a permanent driver; both the driver and the isolated person must wear masks during the entire drive, the isolated person must sit in the back, and the windows of the vehicle must be open during the entire drive.

The isolated person is not permitted to use public transport, including but not limited to domestic flights to Eilat. The isolated person must return to the isolation accommodation immediately in the same transport used.
