

## **Hard lockdown movement Guide**

The following guide seeks to help persons who may need to move during the lockdown to carry with them documents that can be demanded by law enforcement officers. Authorisation permit forms for essential services during lockdown can be requested by heads of essential service institutions from the National COVID-19 Secretariat ("NACOSEC") from the Stakeholder Manager, 'Mating Mahooana at mahooanammm@yahoo.com.

## Movement during hard lockdown - effective 13 JANUARY 2021

Category	<b>Movement Requirements</b>
Essential Service Institutions	<ul> <li>Essential Staff members and contracted outsourced service providers be issued with a permit on a prescribed format by NACOSEC, stamped and signed by Chief Executive Officer of institution.</li> <li>Authorisation permits to clearly state if workers commute at inter-district level.</li> <li>The bearer must at all times carry this permit with the employer ID or national ID in the absence of a valid employer ID.</li> </ul>
Public Transport Owner	<ul> <li>C and D public transport permits issued by the Ministry of Transport, Traffic Department are deemed as authorisation permits for essential services during lockdown.</li> <li>The bearer must at all times have the permit, driving licence and national ID with them.</li> </ul>
Business People	• In the course of delivering essential services, a person shall carry a copy of trader's licence, work ID or national ID in the absence of a valid work ID.
Public Service	<ul> <li>Request for a permit from LMPS with supporting proof</li> <li>A person shall carry a national ID in their possession</li> </ul>

General Member of Public	• A person who requires to buy groceries is expected to remain within boundaries of his or her residential district.
	• A person who requires essential services other than groceries is allowed to travel and seek them in another district provided he or she is carrying a permit from the LMPS.
	• A person requiring medical services will produce healthcare booklet (bukana ea ngakeng) or referral note or letter, check-up note.
	• A person requiring insurance services for burial reasons will produce a death certificate.
