PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (AMENDMENT) (No. 12) REGULATIONS 2020, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.

1. Citation and commencement

- (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 12) Regulations, 2020.
- (2) These Regulations shall come into effect at 11:00p.m. on Thursday the 12^{th} day of November, 2020.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

"principal Regulations" means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No. 16 of 2020

3. Amendment of Regulation 5A paragraph 4.

The principal Regulations are amended in Regulation 5A paragraph 4 by repealing subparagraph "(9)" and substituting the following—

"(9)" Every business owner—

- (a) shall ensure that staff and officers of the business, and every customer or client of a business observe the social distancing protocol and wear a face mask in accordance with the established protocol while conducting said business;
- (b) who fails to ensure that staff and officers of the business, and customers or clients of a business comply with the conditions laid out in subparagraph (9) (a), commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$5,000.00 or to imprisonment for six (6) months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
