Text

Entering permanent establishments for the purpose of purchasing goods and services

§ 1. In the event of the occurrence of COVID-19, the Federal Minister of Social Affairs, Health, Care and Consumer Protection may prohibit by ordinance the entry of permanent establishments or only certain permanent establishments for the purpose of purchasing goods and services, insofar as this is necessary to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The ordinance may regulate the number and time at which permanent establishments that are exempt from the prohibition of entry may be entered.

Entering certain places

- § 2. In the event of the occurrence of COVID-19, a regulation may prohibit entry into certain places to the extent necessary to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The Regulation is
 - 1. issued by the Federal Minister for Social Affairs, Health, Care and Consumer Protection if their application extends to the whole of Germany,
 - to be issued by the Governor if their application extends to the entire territory of the Land, or
 - 3. by the district administrative authority if its application extends to the political district or parts thereof.

The prohibition of entry may be limited to certain times.

Participation of public security service bodies

- § 2a. (1) The organs of the public security service shall support the competent authorities and bodies under this Federal Act by means of their request in the exercise of their described tasks or, if necessary, in the enforcement of the measures provided for by means of coercion.
- (2) If, according to the professional assessment of the competent authorities under this Federal Act, a risk is associated within the framework of the support provided for in paragraph 1 for the organs of the public security service according to the nature of the communicable disease and its possibilities of transmission that can only be countered by special protective measures, the authorities responsible under this Federal Act shall be obliged to: take adequate protective measures.

- § 3. (1) Anyone who enters a permanent establishment whose entry is prohibited in accordance with § 1 commits an administrative offence and is to be punished with a fine of up to EUR 3 600.
- (2) Any person who, as the owner of a permanent establishment, does not ensure that the permanent establishment whose entry is prohibited in accordance with § 1 is not entered, commits an administrative offence and is to be punished with a fine of up to EUR 30 000. Any person who, as the owner of a permanent establishment, does not ensure that the permanent establishment is entered by a maximum of the number of persons specified in the Regulation commits an administrative offence and is to be punished with a fine of up to EUR 3 600.
- (3) Anyone who enters a place whose entry is prohibited in accordance with § 2 commits an administrative offence and is to be punished with a fine of up to EUR 3 600.

Coming into force

- **§ 4.** (1) This Federal Act shall enter into force on the expiry of the date of promulgation and shall cease to apply at the end of 31 December 2020.
- (2) If the Federal Minister has issued an ordinance pursuant to § 1, the provisions of the Epidemic Act 1950, Federal Law Gazette No. 186/1950, concerning the closure of permanent establishments within the scope of this Ordinance shall not apply.
 - (3) The provisions of the Epidemic Act 1950 remain unaffected.
- (4) Ordinances based on this Federal Act may be issued before its entry into force, but may not enter into force before it.

Enforcement

§ 5. The Federal Minister for Social Affairs, Health, Care and Consumer Protection is entrusted with the implementation of this federal law.
