**PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (AMENDMENT) (No. 9) REGULATIONS 2021, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.**

**1. Citation and commencement**

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 9) Regulations, 2021.

(2) These Regulations shall take effect from 5:00am on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2021.

**2. Interpretation**

In these Regulations —

“principal Regulations” means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No.16 of 2020

**3. Amendment of Regulation 5A of principal Regulations**

Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations is amended by repealing paragraph 4A (Closure of Bars and Clubs) in it’s entirety and substituting the following—

“4A-Opening of Bars and Clubs

(1) All Bars and Clubs throughout Antigua and Barbuda are permitted to be open from Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2021 subject to terms agreed to with Cabinet subcommittee and the Ministry of Health. All health protocols are to be strictly observed.

(2) A person who opens, operates, or permit the operation of a Bar or Night Club contrary to subparagraph (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$5,000.00 or to imprisonment for 6 months or to both such fine and imprisonment.”
