Travel restriction / border control

Lifting of COVID-19-related restrictions for entry into Germany with effect as of Saturday, 11 June 2022, 12pm/0.00h CET

From Saturday, 11 June 2022, 12pm/0.00h CET, all COVID-19-related restrictions for entry into Germany will preliminarily be lifted. From that date, travel to Germany will be permitted for all travel purposes (including tourism and visits).

Individuals resident in the People's Republic of China, however, continue to require an important reason for travelling to Germany (reciprocity reservation). For entry into Germany no proof of vaccination, recovery or testing is required any longer.

Visas as required for entry into Germany may be applied for with the German embassies and consulates for all travel purposes. Due to the high demand delays may occur in the issuing of visas.
